YANKEE CLIPPER AWARD

FOR DISTINGUISHED SERVICE TO SQUARE & ROUND DANCING IN NEW ENGLAND

Nominations for the Yankee Clipper Award for Distinguished Service to Square/Round Dancing in New England will be judged upon the following criteria:

- a. The Nominee shall have been active a minimum of ten years in this New England activity.
- b. That during this time the dedicated service to square/round dancing has been of an exemplary nature.
- c. That the Nominee is a 'complete' person; that is, his/her total life brings credit to our activity.
- d. Normally this Award shall be considered a partner award. Service and activities of the partner when applicable shall be considered.
- e. Nominations shall be *confidential* and *not* discussed with the Nominee except as cleared by the Awards Committee in advance of such discussion.
- f. There shall be no announcement of the Award Recipient until the Award has been made publicly.
- g. The decisions of the Awards Committee are final, binding and not subject to review by any other authority.
- h. In making this Award, it shall be understood that the CO-OPeration Committee is acting for square and round dancers in EDSARDA, callers in NECCA, and round dance teachers in NECORTA.

Sheila is currently president of the Square Dance Foundation of New England as well as Clerk for EDSARDA. In 2004, Sheila was presented with the very prestigious Yankee Clipper Award.

In 2015 he served as the General Chairman for the 64th National Sq Dance Conv'n and was the Eastern Region V.P. for the United Square Dancers of America from 2004-07, President 2008/09, and now serves as Chairman of Educational /Publication materials. Lenny received many awards including the Distinguished Service Award, Hall of Fame, Yankee Clipper, and the NE Callers School Pinnacle Award.





RED DOT DANCER


The idea behind the "red dot dancer" is to enable single dancers ease in finding a dance partner. In years past, our single dancers might have had an area to gather or get acquainted gathering to meet and find partners. Today some aggressive solos will maintain a spot in a square until another individual steps up to dance with them. To give all single dancers equal opportunity to enjoy the activity, the "red dot dancer" concept was conceived.

Upon entering a dance, a dancer may wish to display a sticky (easily removeable) red dot on their badge or ribbon. This red dot indicates that you are: 1) a solo dancer (one who does not have a partner OR 2) a dancer who is willing to dance with others for certain tips during the event. If a person's partner doesn't wish or isn't able to dance every tip due to health or other issues, a red dot would show their availability to dance solo.

An additional feature may be added (a star within the red dot) which indicates the ability of the "red dot" wearer to dance either left or right side of the partnership.
